Members of all police forces around the country are undoubtedly shocked, however, Constable Rolfe has made it clear that he will plead not guilty and vigorously contest the charge.

The PFA extends its full support to Constable Rolfe and his family during this difficult time, and indeed to all members of the Northern Territory Police Force who continue to serve the entire community every single day, including our remote indigenous communities.

The Northern Territory Police Association is providing full support to Constable Rolfe and his family, as well as legal representation. This highlights the significance of the work Police Associations do around the nation and the importance of every Police Association to each and every one of its members.
